

The Forestry Estate

The Dr. Aichhorn Forestry Estate is located on two separate sites in Styria and encompasses a total of around 1300 hectares of land at an altitude of 650 m to 1560 m (approx. 2,133 to 5,118 ft.).

There are three separate hunting grounds located in Übelbach, approx. 20 minutes north of Graz. A further hunting ground is located in St. Katharein an der Laming in the district of Bruck an der Mur - Mürzzuschlag.

Spruce pines make up approx. 80% of the main tree species on the Estate. The remaining 20% are beech, larch, maple trees and other deciduous trees.

All of the hunting grounds are accessible on well-maintained forest roads.

Harvesting timber by means of tractors, cable pulleys or harvesters is just as important as cultural maintenance and reforestation, all of which are near and dear to the owner.

Aside from forestry, hunting is a substantial feature of the Dr. Aichhorn Forestry Estate. Red deer, chamois, roe deer and wild boars, and black cock as well, are the traditional game hunted here. There is a red deer feeding station along with several roe deer feeding stations to provide for the game throughout the winter.

The harmony of forestry and hunting is absolutely essential to the Estate which is why great importance is attached to a continuing dialogue among all of those interacting here.
